 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Mahan Air and Ter-

5 rorism Prevention Act of 2017".

6 SEC. 2. REPORT ON AIRPORTS USED BY MAHAN AIR.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the
8 date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter
9 through 2020, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in

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consultation with the Secretary of Transportation, the
 Secretary of State, the Secretary of the Treasury, and the
 Director of National Intelligence, shall submit to Congress
 a report that includes—
 (1) a list of all airports at which aircraft owned
 or controlled by Mahan Air have landed during the

- or controlled by Mahan Air have landed during the
 2 years preceding the submission of the report; and
 (2) for each such airport—
- 9 (A) an assessment of whether aircraft
 10 owned or controlled by Mahan Air continue to
 11 conduct operations at that airport;

12 (B) an assessment of whether any of the
13 landings of aircraft owned or controlled by
14 Mahan Air were necessitated by an emergency
15 situation;

16 (C) a determination regarding whether ad17 ditional security measures should be imposed on
18 flights to the United States that originate from
19 that airport; and

20 (D) an explanation of the rationale for21 that determination.

(b) FORM OF REPORT.—Each report required by
subsection (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form, but
may include a classified annex.

(c) PUBLICATION OF LIST.—The list required by sub section (a)(1) shall be publicly and prominently posted on
 the website of the Department of Homeland Security on
 the date on which the report required by subsection (a)
 is submitted to Congress.
