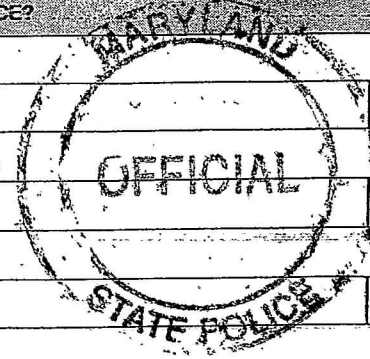

### NARRATIVE:

This investigator and SAO Inv. Ramaley were investigating an incident of suspect child abuse occurring at Camp Farthest Out, located at 915 Steaker Road in Woodbine. These investigators responded to Camp Farthest Out on 07/30/02, and contacted the on-site director, [REDACTED]. At that time, [REDACTED] provided a statement pertaining to the alleged child abuse. Through [REDACTED], these investigators scheduled several interviews with camp counselors for the following morning at approx. 1000 hours.

On 07/31/02, at approx. 1020 hours, this investigator, SAO Inv. Ramaley and CPS Inv. Gearhart, responded to Camp Farthest Out. Upon our arrival, we were met by [REDACTED], Chairman of the Board of Directors of Camp Farthest Out. [REDACTED] requested that he be updated on the alleged child abuse case. At that time, two Reverends joined the meeting. They identified themselves as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. All parties, including [REDACTED], were advised of the status of the investigation. They were informed that we were there to interview several camp counselors who could have information pertaining to the child

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abuse case. At that time, [REDACTED] advised that there could be legal ramifications from the alleged abuse case and that he did not want any more interviews to occur with counselors until "their" attorney could be present. This investigator advised them that we would be conducting the necessary interviews at that time and that "their" attorney (for Camp Earliest Out/Douglas Memorial Community Church) was not connected to the counselors. Additionally, this investigator informed them that if the counselors requested an attorney be present that was their right, however, no one else could invoke their rights to an attorney or their behalf. This investigator informed those present that they could arrange for the interviews to be conducted in private, or these investigators would find and interview the

counselors on their own. [REDACTED] assured these investigators that they would provide a private room for the interviews to be conducted. At that time, this investigator informed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], that they were not to interfere with this investigation, nor were they to discuss the case with anyone. They were told that doing so would constitute hindering and obstruction.

At that time, the first counselor to be interviewed was produced. He was taken into the private office of the on-site director, where he was interviewed by these investigators. That interview was completed with out incident. Following that interview, SAO Inv. Ramaley and CPS Inv. Gearhart contacted camp personnel, and requested a second counselor be produced. Inv. Ramaley and Inv. Gearhart were told that "they" did not like how the things were progressing and therefore, "they" would not be cooperating in the case further.

At that time, the second subject to be interviewed, coincidentally came to the office. He was taken into the private office and advised of his appropriate rights. The subject agreed to be interviewed. Approx. (10) minutes into the interview, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] knocked on the closed office door and entered. [REDACTED] asked if they could be present during this interview. This investigator told them that they could not and directed them to leave the office. [REDACTED] argued that the subject was only (17) years old and demanded that he be present for the interview. Again, this investigator informed the Reverends that they were not permitted to join the interview, and directed them to leave. [REDACTED] argued with this investigator and questioned whether it was against the law for him to be present during this interview. This investigator informed them that they were not permitted to stay and that by not leaving, they were hindering and obstructing this investigation. At that time, [REDACTED] advised that he was not allowing the use of the office for further interviews. This investigator told [REDACTED] that they would finish this interview, and conduct the remaining interviews outside. At that time, Investigators Ramaley and Gearhart accompanied the subject being interviewed, to an outside

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picnic area. This investigator then confronted the Reverends and explained that they were hindering this investigation and that if they interfered with any more interviews, or any part of the investigation, that they would be arrested. [REDACTED] questioned why this investigator was threatening them. This investigator explained to the Reverends that what they were doing was committing a crime for which they could be arrested.

This investigator then joined Investigators Ramaley and Gearhart in the picnic area with the subject being interviewed. This investigator resumed her questioning of the subject. Approx. (5) to (10) minutes later, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] approached these investigators and the subject being interviewed. This investigator commented to the Reverends that she was surprised to see them in light of the recent conversation. [REDACTED] advised that he had just spoken to "their" lawyer and was told to sit in on the interview. [REDACTED] further questioned whether the subject being questioned was advised of his rights, and demanded that he be represented by counsel. This investigator was forced to end the interview with the subject being questioned because of the Reverends' interference. The Reverends were again told by this investigator that they were interfering with this case and suggested to them that they were not being provided correct information by "their" attorney. These investigators walked away from the Reverends and attempted to locate other counselors to be interviewed.

This investigator approached several campers standing in line outside the cafeteria. She asked them if they knew where (2) specific counselors would be found. The campers pointed to (2) adult male subjects walking towards the cafeteria and identified them as the subjects being sought. This investigator approached one of the subjects and identified herself as a Maryland State Trooper. The subject declined to be interviewed at that time. Minutes later, another camper approached these investigators and said, "you are talking to the wrong guy. You want...." Before the camper could finish his sentence, [REDACTED] grabbed the camper by the arm and directed him away from these investigators. [REDACTED] told the camper that he was not to talk to these people (meaning these investigators).

At that time, this investigator attempted to contact the Deputy State's Attorney to discuss the interference into this investigation. A decision was made to arrest [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] for hindering and obstructing a police officer during a lawful investigation.

This investigator took both Reverends into custody with the assistance of several uniformed Troopers.



## NARRATIVE

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Trooper First Class Leonard and Trooper Masimore transported the Reverends to the Westminster Barrack. Neither were questioned about this incident, nor were they advised of their rights. Upon completion of the necessary paperwork, this investigator transported [REDACTED] and Sgt. DeWees transported [REDACTED] to the Carroll County Central Booking Unit. During transport, [REDACTED] made several statements to Sgt. DeWees. See his supplemental report for details.

I request this case be closed by arrest.

## NARRATIVE

DATE AND TIME OF INCIDENT: July 31, 2002 at approximately 1340 hours

LOCATION OF INCIDENT: Camp Farthest Out 915 Streaker Road, Woodbine, Carroll Co., Md.

## NARRATIVE:

On July 31, 2002 at approximately 1230 hours Tfc. Danielle Barry contacted me by telephone to advise that she was being hindered by two camp ministers while attempting to conduct a child abuse investigation at Camp Farthest Out in Woodbine. Tfc. Barry explained that the two ministers, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], were being extremely uncooperative and disruptive. Tfc. Barry explained that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] entered a room while she was speaking with a witness. Tfc. Barry explained that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] interfered by telling campers and counselors that they were not to speak with the police.

I then contacted Deputy State's Attorney Tracey Gilmore and State's Attorney Jerry F. Barnes and explained the circumstances to them. Both agreed that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] should be arrested for hindering Tfc. Barry. I then re-contacted Tfc. Barry and told her to arrest the two and bring them to the barracks.

At approximately 1340 hours Tfc. Barry arrested both suspects and transported them to the barracks. I then responded to the barracks and assisted Tfc. Barry with the paperwork. I later transported [REDACTED] to the Carroll County Central Booking Unit. While riding in my car to Central Booking [REDACTED] complimented me on how professional the troopers have been. [REDACTED] said, "I'm impressed with how polite and professional troopers have been throughout this entire incident", and "we didn't mean to get in the way." [REDACTED] was very cooperative during the time I spent with him. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were eventually released to the Central Booking Unit.
