Executive Summary

Israel is a constant topic in American college campus newspapers. Since 2017, the select 75 campuses reviewed published almost 2,000 articles on Israel and Jewish issues.

Of the 1,450 articles that address Israel, over a third – 532 – present the Jewish State in a negative way. Only 17% provided a positive view of the country. Over half of Op-Eds addressing Israel on all college campuses – 307 out of 585 – were negative. Pro-Israel students, alumni, and others produced 210 positive Op-Eds about the country across all 75 campuses.

Though the Liberal Arts Colleges were the least prolific of the universities – publishing only 246 articles, compared to the 766 of the Public Universities and the 946 of the Private Schools – they were also the most negative. All top five of the most negative campuses by percentage were Liberal Arts Colleges.

Trends

Most Op-Eds supportive of Israel include caveats from the student that s/he does not agree with all Israel's decisions. A 2020 University of Michigan article emphasized, "There is no issue to be had with a protest of the Israeli government's actions; many can agree that the state's politics are deeply flawed." Students will go as far as to defend their attackers to appear fair-minded. In 2018, a USC student wrote, "[a]s an Israeli-born American citizen, I condemn SJP for skewing facts about how my home country handles policy toward Palestinians. I condemn their refusal to acknowledge the terrorist acts Palestinians in Gaza engage in, especially when Hamas fired over 400 rockets in less than a day at Israeli citizens last week. But I cannot take away this group's right to speak". In 2019, a Yale undergrad defended Congresswoman Ilhan Omar's antisemitic tweets, claiming her criticisms were of Israel, not of Jews.

Many universities publish articles from students who take this differentiation still further, attempting to decouple Judaism from Israel, leading to articles that insist that anti-Zionism is rarely antisemitism. A 2019 Stanford Op-Ed written by the campus's Jewish Voice for Peace (JVP) co-presidents "implore[d] the greater Stanford community to pay attention to opportunistic accusations of antisemitism against students of color" and emphasized they "reject[ed] the idea that the historical suffering of our communities be leveraged to defend an ethnostate that murders human rights journalists, detains Palestinian children, and deflects these conversations at all costs with perilously false accusations of antisemitism".

This attempt to separate bias against Jews from bias against Israel leaks into what is presumably meant to be neutral journalism. A 2020 Columbia article reporting on the campus's fourth incident of antisemitic graffiti that year claimed, "[t]here is no data to support the relationship between the passage of BDS resolutions at universities and anti-Semitic hate crimes," without citing a source.

Some campuses do not mention antisemitism as a prejudice against the Jewish people. Syracuse University saw a spate of incidents involving antisemitic graffiti on campus throughout the end of 2019 and into 2020 but the reporting never mentioned Jews or Judaism.

Other news reports, meant to describe events on campus dispassionately, present bias by either adopting the language of anti-Israel activists in their reporting or failing to provide context or

counterpoints. While reporting on a JVP event in 2021, Northwestern's then-Assistant Campus Editor described Israel's declaration of independence as, "the Nakba, when the newly-created Israeli state displaced over 750,000 Palestinians in 1948, and connected them to violence by Israeli forces in the West Bank and Gaza today."

Methodology

Bullpen Strategy Group, on behalf of Alums for Campus Fairness, undertook an investigation of articles related to Israel and Jewish issues published by the primary campus newspaper at 75 colleges and universities. Researchers reviewed 1,958 pertinent articles and categorized them as Op-Eds, editorials, or news reports. Researchers then determined bias – whether the article presented Israel and/or Jewish issues in a positive, negative, or neutral way. Tagging Articles

Some articles that may include the key terms were not included if they did not fit within the purview of the review, including articles that mentioned Israel as an individual's first name or as an ancillary, not-central part of the article. Further, in cases in which the only mention of "Palestine" in the article was reference to the campus Students for Justice in Palestine group, researchers did not apply the "Palestinian" tag to the article but did tag the article with appropriate key terms. Articles focused on the movement against South African apartheid were also not included.

Identifying Bias

Researchers held these articles up to basic journalistic scrutiny. For example, in cases in which an article presented only one side of an argument or the student journalist did not note that s/he had attempted to contact an opposing party, the article was tagged "negative" for source bias.

Examples of such bias occurred in a 2021 Stanford Daily article titled, "Stanford students rally in solidarity with Palestine," available here. There is no evidence the journalist attempted to reach out to the campus pro-Israel or Jewish community for comment, instead choosing to provide column inches exclusively to anti-Israel activists.

Stanford Daily journalists had previously reported on contentious campus issues in a neutral way. In 2019, in "Eli Valley condemns SCR, Zionist support of 'white supremacists," a different student journalist did reach out to campus groups on both sides of the issue, resulting in a "neutral" tag.

In general, researchers analyzed articles through the lens of whether a Jewish or Israeli student would read such an article and feel as though the information was presented fairly (neutral) or provided to present Judaism or Israel in a specific light (positive or negative).

There was a consistent and constant decoupling of students' Jewish identity from their perspectives on Israel, to the point that some students expressed frustration that they were expected to have an opinion on the Jewish State at all. Many campuses showed a penchant for moving away from using the phrase, "antisemitic" or any of its iterations, choosing to describe campus prejudice as "anti-Jewish." In these cases, in which Israel may have received negative coverage but Judaism was presented in a neutral or positive way, researchers tagged such articles as "negative."

Further, many student journalists wrote news articles referring to the Gaza Strip as "occupied" by Israel. Israel withdrew from the Gaza Strip in 2005, a move recognized and lauded by the U.S. government. Articles that overtly misrepresented the current status quo and presented factually inaccurate information were marked as "negative" reporting.

NOTE: Several University of Maryland articles in The Diamondback appeared to have coding errors. Multiple articles appeared with dates listed as December 31, 0999. Since these publication dates could not be identified, those articles have not been included in the analysis.


