I N D I C T M E N T

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a): Tampering
With Consumer Products]

The Grand Jury charges:

COUNT ONE

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]

On or about April 22, 2016, in Orange County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a freezer

1 containing bagged ice sold at a grocery store in Dana Point,

COUNT TWO

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]

On or about November 10, 2018, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a refrigerated dairy section containing cheese sold at a grocery store in Los Angeles, California.

COUNT THREE

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]

On or about November 28, 2018, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a refrigerator containing dairy products sold at a grocery store in Manhattan Beach, California.

COUNT FOUR

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]

On or about December 14, 2018, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a refrigerator containing alcohol sold at a grocery store in Manhattan Beach, California.

COUNT FIVE

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]

On or about December 16, 2018, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a freezer containing ice sold at a grocery store in Redondo Beach, California.

COUNT SIX

[18 U.S.C. § 1365(a)]


On or about January 20, 2019, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DAVID CLARE LOHR, with reckless disregard for the risk that another person would be placed in danger of death or bodily injury, and under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to such risk, knowingly and intentionally tampered with and attempted to tamper with a consumer product and the container of such product affecting interstate commerce, namely, by opening a bottle of bleach and pouring the bleach into a freezer containing seafood sold at a grocery store in West Hollywood, California.
