Made By Governor To Take  
Effect From Monday

The Governor has made the following appointments and transfers in the Resident Magistrate's Courts with effect from Monday, the 1st of June, 1925:

Mr. H. H. Bruce, Resident Magistrate for St. Ann, to be Resident Magistrate for Portland.

Mr. J. R. C. Morris, Resident Magistrate for Portland, to act as Resident Magistrate for St. Mary.

Mr. W. H. Brandon, Acting Resident Magistrate for St. Mary, to act as Resident Magistrate for Clarendon, vice Mr. J. J. King.

His Excellency has appointed Mr. T. L. W. Tucker, Assistant in the office of the Resident Magistrate for St. Andrew, to act as Clerk of the Courts for the parish during Mr. MacGregor's absence.

The Governor has appointed Mr. Wm. Scholefield, Clerk of the Courts, St. Ann, to act as Resident Magistrate for St. Ann, and the Clerk of Mandeville to-day, and at the Circuit Court at Savanna-la-Mar on Monday. His Excellency has appointed Mr. T. L. W. Tucker, Assistant in the office of the Resident Magistrate for St. Andrew, to act as Clerk of the Courts for the parish during Mr. MacGregor's absence.
