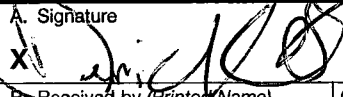

In the interest of assuring a safe and healthy workplace, the Oregon Occupational Safety and Health Division (Oregon OSHA) conducted an inspection at a workplace under your control. During this inspection, violations of the Oregon Safe Employment Act and occupational health and/or safety rules were found.

On March 13, 2016, a comprehensive health inspection was opened with Christina Lawson (Office Mgr.). The inspection was conducted by Saeid Attaran, Health Compliance Officer, OR-OSHA and took place at 4242 NE Alberta Street in Portland, Oregon.

Deans Car Care Inc. is a privately owned and operated general auto repair shop. They service all types of cars, trucks, and vans and specialize in VW diesel engines, Volvo 240s, and water-cooled Vanagons. The shop also offers Volvo engine conversions for Vanagons (Volvagons).

The employer was also listed in the isocyanate emphasis program; however, observation and employer/employee interviews indicated that the company does not perform any spray painting, restoration, and body and dent repairs.

### **History:**

Dean started his own mobile car repair service in Hawaii in 2005. He relocated his business to Portland in 2007. Business grew via word-of-mouth quickly, and in the summer of 2011, he established the company.

### **Walk-around:**

The inspected location is about 3000 ft<sup>2</sup> property. However, the space is shared with Alameda Metal Work Company and Dean's Car Care Inc. Dean's Car Care occupied 1200 ft<sup>2</sup> of the space and includes a small Admin Office and a Repair Shop. The company has been occupying this location since 2011. This is a non-union shop and employed a total of 5 employees (including Owners) during the course of inspection.

The nature of their job includes, but is not limited to; brake, engine, transmission, and suspension repairs, tune-ups, AC repairs, battery replace, tire rotations, touch-up painting, and minor electrical repairing.

Observation and employer/employee interviews indicated that the employees were aware of asbestos hazards while they working on brakes (used wet method & proper PPE). Exhaust hose also available inside the Shop, when they idling engines inside the workplace. The employer used two lifts inside the Shop. Both were equipped with safety devices.

Observation during walk-around also indicated that the employer did not complete annual maintenance on the portable fire extinguisher located inside the Shop. The last check was recorded on July 2013.

**Records Review:**

After the initial walk-around of the entire facility and interview of employees, the following documents were requested and reviewed by the HCO.

- a) **Hazard Communication/GHS Program:** A written program was not developed and did not exist in the workplace. There were no SDSs at the jobsite. In addition, records review and employer/employee interviews indicated the employees who handled chemicals were not provided with proper hazcom/GHS training.
- b) **Safety Meetings** – Records review and employer/employee interviews indicated the employer failed to establish and administer a safety committee or have effective safety meetings on a monthly basis.
- c) **PPE-** Observation and employer/employee interviews indicated that the PPE such as safety glasses, gloves, uniforms, ear plugs and ear muffs, and paper dust masks were provided by the employer and were adequate for duties being performed.

**Employer Knowledge:**

It was noted that Dean (Owner) approved the purchase of all tools, equipment, chemicals, and PPE. He was aware of OR-OSHA, used the consultation service in the past (2014), and responsible of day to day activities inside the Shop including mechanical and electrical repairs, tune-ups, and limited welding and grinding.

A closing conference was held on April 27, 2017, with Christina Lawson (Office Mgr.), and Dean Gluesenkamp (Owner) at Dean's Car Care Inc. covering all items on the closing conference form. The employer was cited for lack of a written hazcom program, for lack of SDS/MSDSs for each chemicals used at the facility, for lack of basic hazcom/GHS training for all employees, for not maintaining the portable fire extinguisher annually, and for failing to conduct monthly safety meetings.

The methods to improve safety & health in general were discussed with the employer and necessary information regarding respirators, asbestos, machine guarding, proper auto lifts, eye wash, portable fire extinguisher, safety committee, PPE, and OR-OSHA consultation service was provided to the employer during the closing conference. The staff was very cooperative and provided all necessary assistance.

This would include tasks such as chemical exposure, welding, and various work tasks within your shop. You must verify the assessment by documenting the location, the person who did the assessment, and the date.**

**Safety meetings must:**

- \*Include all available employees.**
- \*Include at least one employer representative (CHRIS) authorized to ensure correction of safety and health issues.**
- \*Be held on company time and attendees paid at their regular rate of pay.**

**Purpose:**

- \*The purpose of safety committees and safety meetings is to bring workers and management together in a non-adversarial, cooperative effort to promote safety and health.**
- \*Safety committees and safety meetings will assist you in making continuous improvement to your safety and health programs.**
- \*Document names of attendees.**

**\*Document meeting date.**

**\*Document all safety and health issues discussed, including tools, equipment, work environment, and work practice hazards.**

**\*Document recommendations for corrective action and a reasonable date by which management agrees to respond.**

**\*Elect person(s) responsible for follow up on any recommended corrective actions.**

**\*Document all reports, evaluations and recommendations made by the committee.**
